Lesson Goals

Lesson Details (45 minutes total)

Opening Routine

Time:

To help create routine and sooth anxiety, every class should begin with the same activity. Consider creating an opening routine that allows students to move, incorporates rhythm, and invites students to offer something (a dance move, a clapped rhythm, a silly sound) that is repeated back by either just one other person or by the whole group.

Warm Up Introduction to basic dance movements

Time: 8 mins
Students will follow along to a dance warm up that includes plies, tendus, degages, and

sautes

If time allows, continue to work on leaps and falls

Lesson Intro Partnering facial expressions

Time: 6 mins
Students will partner up and stand facing each other

The teacher will say an emotion and the students will have to use their faces and their

bodies to express that emotion

This will continue for many different emotions

The teacher and students will discuss how they knew what each emotion was and will talk

about how different emotions are show differently in different bodies

Brain break Choose a brain break in the moment. Brain break used will determine whether the energy of

Time: the room becomes energized, calmed, or focused.

Main Lesson Students will use locomotor movement to show different emotions

Time: 15 mins
In a whole group, students will do different locomotor movements that are attached to an

emotion that the teacher calls out (joyful skip, sad walk, excited bounce, etc)

Students will then break into groups, 1 group will do different movements/emotions, but the

teacher will tell them in secret while the 2nd group has to guess the emotion

We will continue this with a few emotions/movements and switch groups

We will discuss how we could tell what movement/emotions they were portraying

Cool down/Closing Similar to the opening routine, your closing should be the same activity each day as an

Time: expected way to signal the end of the class and transition to what comes next.
